Dear members and friends of Christ Church,

Like most folks, Episcopalians have certain words that provoke negative reactions. We joke that 'evangelism' is a dirty word because it makes us think of strangers knocking on our doors or approaching us in public places, even though evangelism is as simple (and necessary) as inviting a friend to a church event. We know to tune out when the preacher dramatically introduces and then proceeds to explain a fancy Greek word like *kenosis* (the self-emptying of Jesus as described in Philippians 2:5-11). We often hear "I'm from the Diocese" as prelude to unhelpful advice at best and chastisement, asking for money, or a threat to our continuing congregational vitality at worst.

'Discernment' is one such word, because we usually hear it in contexts that do not bode well for the parish. When we talk about an individual in discernment, it's usually because they're in the process of discerning whether God is calling them to ordained ministry, which in many cases results in the parish losing an active lay leader (either to seminary, ordination, and work in another parish, or to withdrawal after the call is not affirmed). Parishes generally enact discernment processes at the behest of someone from the Diocese during times of potentially difficult transition, like preparing to search for a new rector after the departure of the old one or considering the closure of the church or merging with another one.

Discernment does not have to be a scary word, however. Wiktionary's definition of discernment is "perceiving, understanding, and judging things clearly, especially those that aren't obvious or straightforward," and for Christians, God's call in our lives is the thing we typically think of that is not obvious or straightforward and thus requires work for us to perceive and understand it. So anytime we are intentionally listening for God's call and figuring out how to act in response to that call, we are discerning. Or to put it another way, anytime we Christians, individually or in a group, ask God to tell us what to do, we are in discernment. In that sense, discerning is not unusual or scary, but a regular part of our relationship with God in prayer.

My hope is that all of us are praying daily for Christ Church, and that in doing so we are discerning, asking God to guide us and paying attention for God's responses, not because some big or bad change is coming, but because the Church should always be in discernment, and most especially in times like these, when the way to navigate the challenges we face is not obvious or straightforward.

The Beverly S. Parrish, Jr. Christian Leadership Award

Christian, Scholar, Soldier

"May God grant that the spirit of this award will help us increase in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man."

Since 1957, whenever possible, Christ Church has presented this annual award to a young person(s) who best represent the spirit of Beverly S. Parrish, Jr. A plaque to honor his life and in recognition of our eligible youth who exemplify his admirable traits, is displayed in the narthex of the church.

Beverly S. Parrish, Jr., was awarded many academic accolades for his achievements as a young man. To name a few, he was an Eagle Scout, active youth member of Christ Church, a successful student of science and engineering, and a distinguished member of several military groups while attending college. He was a 1st Lieutenant in the United States Air Force.

Beverly S. Parrish, Jr., was an active member of Christ Church who served as a crucifer for many years. He continues to be remembered for his honors and achievements, but more importantly, for his personal qualities of kindness, strong sense of duty, and dependability. He had a "can do" attitude and was ready to assist his family and friends to the best of his ability. He was a Christian in every sense of the word.

Criteria for the Award

I. Service to Church (the Christian Spirit and Christian Leadership)

1. The Christian spirit: Acceptance of responsibility for Church, Sunday School, and other duties; Sense of acceptance of duty to God; Sense of reverence; Sense of loyalty to the Church; Humility and unselfishness; Friendliness and cheerfulness; Bible learning, prayer.

2. Participation in Church Activities: Choir, Crucifer, Acolyte, Youth Group, Young Altar Guild, Chalice Bearer, or Lay Reader;

- 3. Serving on committees;
- 4. Serving as a leader in Youth Group;
- 5. Serving at church activities such as Loaves & Fishes, mission trips;
- 6. Attendance in Sunday school and at church services

II. <u>Service to school</u>: Conduct/behavior; Special academic achievements; Extracurricular activities; Leadership experience; Sportsmanship/athletics; Artistic expression

III. <u>Service to Community</u>: Participation as a volunteer; Participation in organizations (Scouting, etc.); Participation in summer/part-time employment; Participation in local arts groups; Participation in civic groups.
